

DAY TRIPS

Trip 1: The American Frontier Wednesday, September 13th in Oklahoma City, OK

Our first day trip of the fall will take us south to OKC where we will visit two phenomenal museums: the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum and the First Americans Museum. The First Americans Museum, which opened in 2021, showcases the collective histories of the 39 distinct tribal nations that reside in Oklahoma today, and the National Cowboy Museum is a premier institution of Western history and culture. During our trip, the latter will play host to a visiting exhibit on panoramic photography called the *Widewest*. Throughout this funfilled day trip, together, we'll experience art, living culture, and unique perspectives while learning more about western history and heritage.

This trip will leave at approximately 7:45am and return to Cowley College around 6:15pm. Lunch is included, and the cost is \$45.

Trip 2: Svensk Hyllningsfest

Friday, October 13th in Lindsborg, KS

Occurring in October of odd numbered years, the residents of Lindsborg, KS host a community-wide festival and don traditional Swedish folk costumes to celebrate the Swedish pioneers who settled the Smoky Valley in 1868 – 1869. The festival features art and crafts, special foods, ethnic music, and other special entertainment while Swedish folk dancers and musicians add to the flavor of the festival. For our October day trip, we'll be attending day one of the festival! There will be many exhibitions to explore, but our day will culminate with one of the bestloved events: the Swedish Smörgåsbord. We will savor the Smörgåsbord, a Scandinavian feast. Most of the food is prepared from recipes handed

down from the early Swedish settlers of the Smoky Valley area, but some is imported from through Swedish vendors. All with the goal of an authentic Swedish Smörgåsbord that closely resembles those of yesteryear. This trip will leave at approximately 10:00am and return to Cowley College around 9:00pm. Dinner is included, and the cost is \$45.

Trip 3: Mystery Trip

Tuesday, November 7th / Mystery Location

The reputation of a Golden Tigers Mystery Trip proceeded itself. Before Micah took over as Coordinator, mystery trips were a yearly occurrence. We are happy to be able to offer one again. A mystery trip is exactly what it sounds like. Our destination is top secret, kept under lock and key. The Golden Tigers may or may not have been there before. The only hint is that we won't travel further than three hours of driving time in one direction. If you are up for an adventure, like surprises, and are flexible, this is the trip for you. The only rule: you get what you get, and you don't throw a fit. ⁽²⁾ We'll leave at approximately 8am and return to Cowley College around 6:00pm. Lunch is included, and the cost of the trip is \$50.
